Every year about 1.6 million people ^{visit} this jaw-dropping site.



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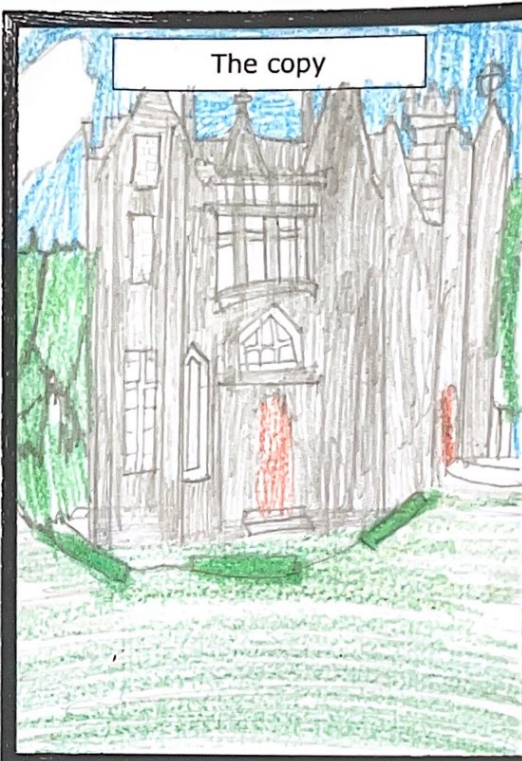

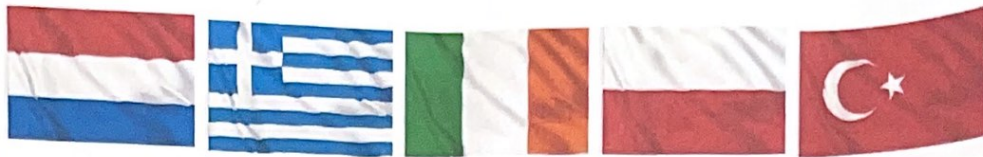

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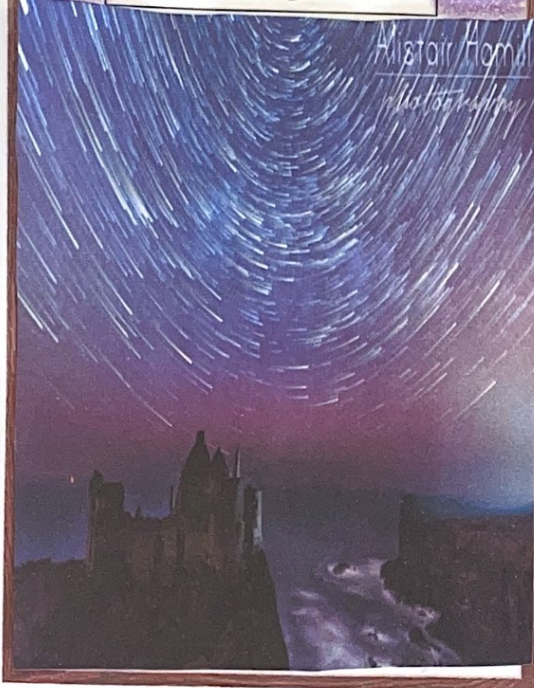

From west to east, the islands are: Inishmore the largest, Inishmaan, the second-largest, and inisheer, the smallest.

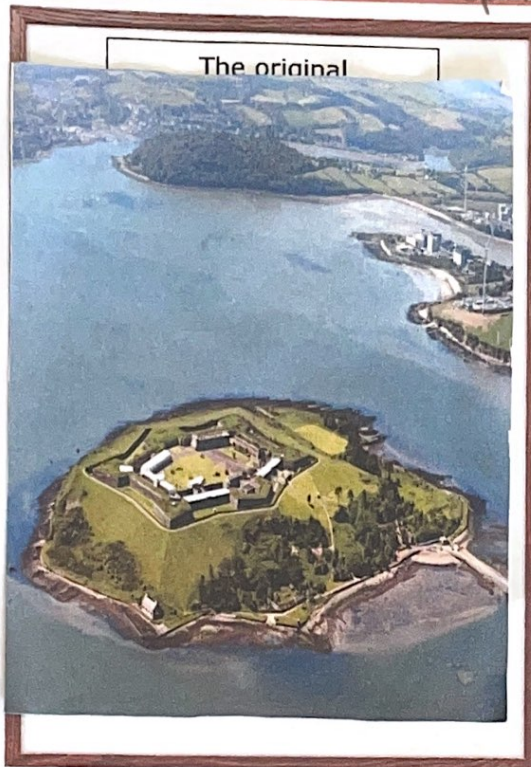

3. The walk has two names, Cuilcagh and stairway to heaven!



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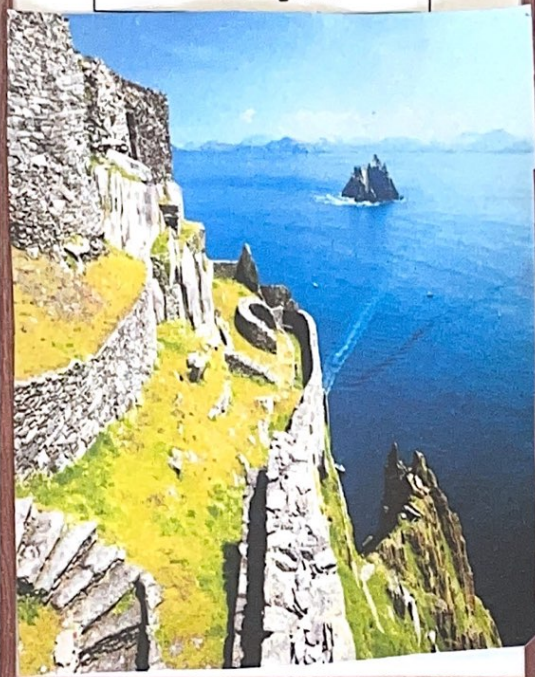

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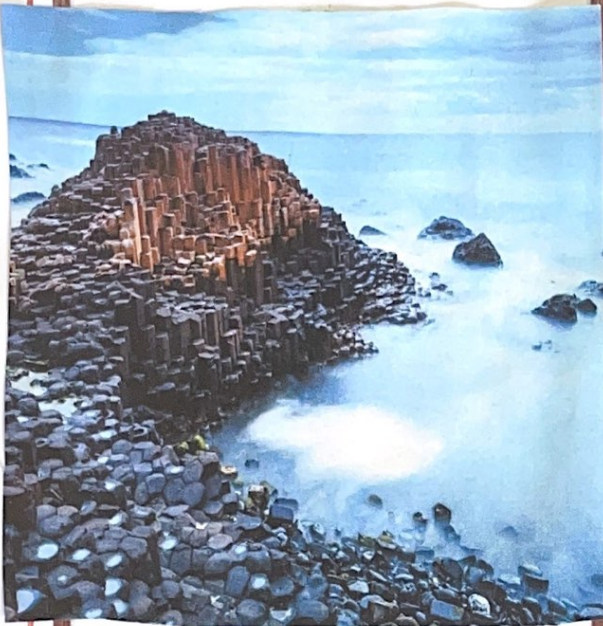

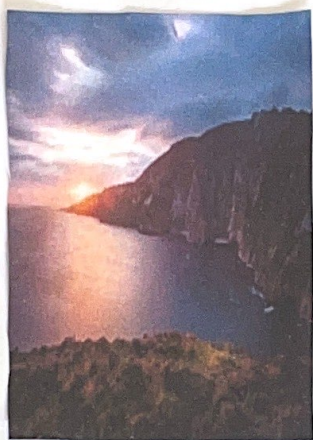

It has some of the Highest sea cliffs of moher in county clare slieve, League's cliffs reach almost three times Higher.



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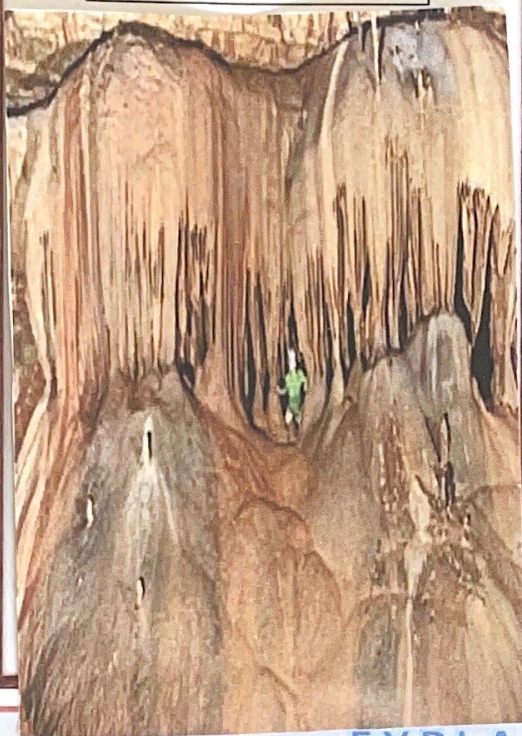

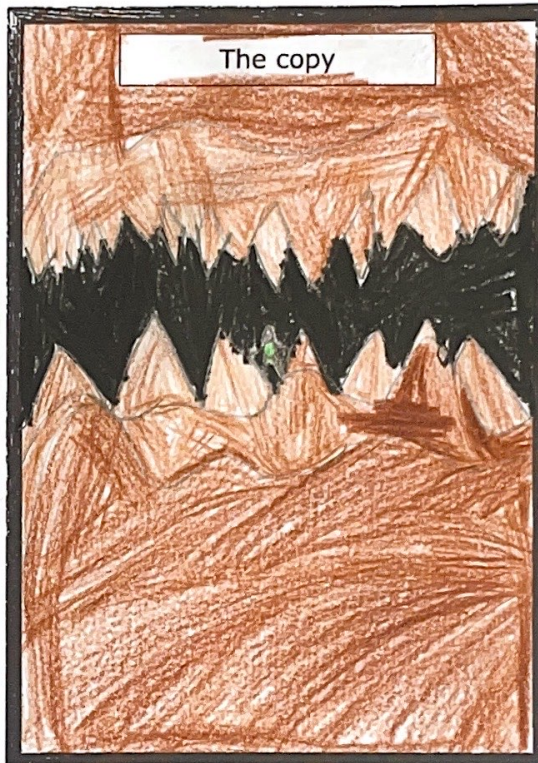

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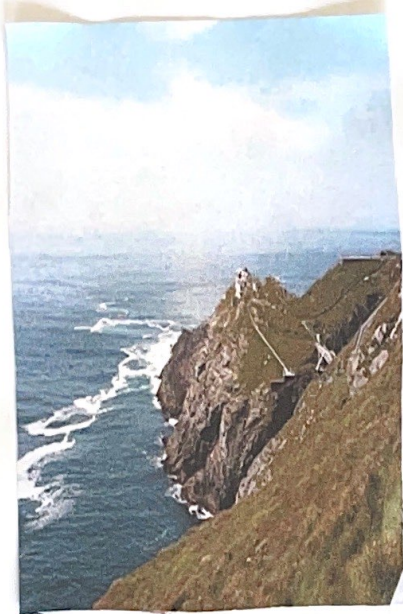
