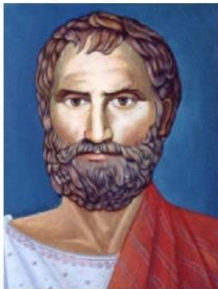

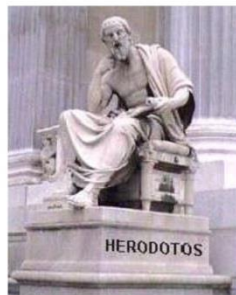

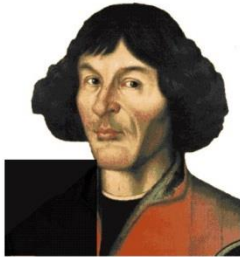

Bucharest's vast Palace of the Parliament, begun during the final years of Nicolae Ceaușescu's rule and finished in 1997 (seven years after his death), is 240 metres long, 270 metres wide, 86 metres high (12 storeys), and cost a staggering €3 billion (£2.5bn) to build. It has 1,100 rooms.
